SUPER BOWL SITUATIONS

Let's take a look at some interesting situations about Super Bowl matchups. Here are the answers to recent questions about past Super Bowls. **How does a lower seed do?** The playoffs expanded in 1990 and the NFL seeded teams 1 thru 6. In 2010 it was only the second time in 16 years that a #1 seed had failed to make the Super Bowl and the only time with a matchup between the #2 and #6 seeds. With the Rams and Bengals earning the trip, the team ranked as the #4 seed or lower has reached the Super Bowl 8 times in the last 15 years, winning it 5 times. One of the most surprising stats is that the LOWER SEED is now 11-3 SU and 12-2 ATS. Although that will not happen TY as it's a battle of #4 seeds. **What happens when an AFC/NFC Title game favorite was outgained?** Six years ago BOTH teams were outgained in the conf finals but SF was a favorite. In 2011 New England was outgained 398-330 and of course was upset. In 2010 the Pittsburgh Steelers were outgained by the NY Jets 289-287 and since 1992, only 10 teams have been outgained as favorites in the title gm and went on to play in the Super Bowl. In 2009 the New Orleans Saints were outgained 475-257 but of course went on to beat Indianapolis. The Bears were outgained in 2007 by a 364-340 edge and then lost and failed to cover vs Indy. In 2005 New England was outgained 388-322 vs PIT and won but did not cover in the SB 24-21 (-7). In 1998 Denver was outgained 370-331 and won the SB 34-19 (-7) and was outgained in '97 but won 31-24 (+11). Pittsburgh was outgained in '95 (328-285) and went on to cover the SB 27-17 (+13.5) and SF won the SB 49-26 (-18) in '94 after being outgained by 157 yds by DAL. DEN was the latest to win and cover 5Y ago in the SB (+4', 24-10 win over CAR) after being outgained by NE (336-244). In '17 the Patriots were outgained (374-344) by Jacksonville in their come-from-behind win and would later go on to lose outright in the Super Bowl as a favorite against the Eagles. In '19 the #1 seed 49ers were narrowly outgained (358-354) in their easy win over the Packers. CIN was outgained by KC TY. Teams are 5-4 SU and 6-3 ATS (dog is 4-1 ATS). **Thinking about a record?** The most combined total points in a Super Bowl came in SB 29 as SF and SD combined for 75 pts. 2017's PHI/NE matchup nearly reached the mark at 74 pts followed by 69 total pts twice as DAL defeated BUF and TB beat OAK. LY's opening total for the Chiefs and Bucs is 57 although that game saw just 40 tll pts. The fewest points scored had previously been 1975 when PIT and MIN combined for 22 pts in SB 9 while MIA and WAS combined for 21 pts in SB 7. However, 2018's meeting between the Patriots and Rams set a new record at just 16 comb pts. **Quick starts?** The final thing we'll look at is how teams have started and scored in the 1Q. It has been slow going as in the last 23 Super Bowls only FOUR TIMES have the teams combined for over 10 total points in the opening period (KC/TB 10 pts LY). Five times in the last 21 years has seen a 3-0 score after 1Q and on 5 occasions (incl '19) both teams failed to score. **GOTTA LOVE THOSE PROPS!!** Over the last 14 seasons we've had solid success with our Super Bowl prop plays. In fact we are now 126-83 (60%) on those releases!

GAME OVERVIEW - Following their first win over the 49ers in the last 7 contests where they overcame a 10-7 HT deficit and finished with 25-16 FD and 396-282 yard edges, the Rams are back in the Super Bowl for the 2nd time in the last 4 years and 5th time overall. The Bengals meanwhile have earned a berth in the "Big Game" for the 1st time since 1988 (narrow 20-16 loss to SF) after picking up an OT win in Arrowhead with 2nd year QB Joe Burrow throwing for 250 yds and 2 TD's (overcame 21-3 deficit in 1H). The past 12 SB's have seen the AFC and NFC split at 6 apiece while the favorite has gone just 8-12 SU/6-14 ATS the past 20 years ("Over" has hit in 6 of the L/11).

RECORD VS THE SPREAD - While the Rams have covered 6 of their L/9 heading in, they did drop the cover against SF in the NFC Championship by the slimmest of margins with a 3 pt win as 3.5 pt chalk. On the year the Rams were a mediocre 10-9-1 ATS. The Bengals meanwhile are on quite the ATS hot streak coming in with a 6-0-1 ATS run to move their seasonal mark to 12-6-2 ATS on the year. The Rams are now 5-5 SU (3-7 ATS) against foes with a winning record (+8 ypg, -5 TO's) while CIN has gone 7-3 SU (7-2-1 ATS) against winning foes (-10 ypg, +4 TO's).

EDGE: BENGALS

TURF/SITE - This marks the first time that the Bengals have visited SoFi Stadium (opened in '20) while the Rams become just the 2nd team in Super Bowl History (also 2nd straight, TB LY) to host the "Big Game". The home-field advantage is not as you would expect however as the Rams have had the visiting team flood their stadium throughout the year (SF may have had the crowd edge in the NFC Championship) while a good portion of the overall crowd is filled with NFL exec's and league sponsors.

SMALL EDGE: RAMS

RAMS #9 OFFENSE VS BENGALS #18 DEFENSE - The Rams finished the 2021 campaign with the #9 total offense in the NFL (T-#7 scoring) behind the newly acquired Matt Stafford (4886, 67.2%, 41-17) and WR Cooper Kupp who won the Triple Crown in Receiving with a league-best 145 receptions, 1,947 yards and 16 TD catches. The Bengals defense was a middle of the pack group finishing #18 in total D and #17 in points allowed. The strength of their defense comes up front as they allowed just 102.5 ypg on the ground, good enough for 5th best in the NFL.

SMALL EDGE: RAMS

BENGALS #13 OFFENSE VS RAMS #17 DEFENSE - The Bengals saw their offense take off (#13 ttl, T-#7 scoring) in '21 with Joe Burrow (300+ yds passing in 5 of L/8 grms) looking sharp in his first full year (missed part of rookie ssn w/ACL) and the emergence of his former college teammate at WR in Ja'Marr Chase who finished 4th in the NFL with 1,455 yards as a rookie. Similar to the Bengals defense, the Rams finished #17 in yards allowed (#15 in scoring D) with their front-7 allowing just 103.2 ypg on the ground (#6 in NFL).

SMALL EDGE: BENGALS

RAMS #18 SPECIAL TEAMS VS BENGALS #26 SPECIAL TEAMS - Not too much of a difference between the Special Teams groups of the Rams and Bengals as while LA finished #18 compared to CIN's #26, it was CIN rookie K Evan McPherson who deserves as much credit as anybody on the roster for getting the Bengals to the Super Bowl with a magnificent playoff performance thus far where he's connected on a perfect 12-12 FG's (3-3 from 50+) including a pair of game-winners against the Titans and Chiefs.

COACHING - This marks the 2nd Super Bowl appearance in 4 years for Sean McVay while CIN HC Zac Taylor had just a 6-25-1 mark his first 2 years in the NFL before leading the Bengals to the "Big Game" in 2021. The Rams also have some proven assistants on hand including DC Raheem Morris who served as HC for the Bucs from '09-'11 and interim HC in ATL a year ago.

LARGE EDGE: RAMS

PAST HISTORY MATCHUP/INTANGIBLES - The Rams and Bengals don't have much of a past history as they've met on just 14 other occasions dating back to 1972 with the Bengals holding a slight 8-6 advantage including victories in 3 of the L/4. The Rams did however pick up the win in their most recent meeting back in '19 which was played across the pond in London (24-10 win as 12 pt chalk).

CONCLUSION - For the first time since at least the NFL merger in 1966, the #1, #2 and #3 seeds from each conference will not be respeated in the Super Bowl. Instead, we have a pair of #4 seeds in the Rams who many thought could make it here (6/1 odds to win the NFC Championship) and the Bengals who many thought would finish last in their own division (50/1 odds to reach the Super Bowl!). The Bengals clearly gained some traction as December and January has worn on with their regular season comeback victory against the Chiefs announcing to the nation that they would be a presence in the AFC! Let's not forget about the Rams however as the talent of both sides of the ball is worth mentioning with the huge season from WR Cooper Kupp over to the defensive side with superstars such as Aaron Donald, Von Miller and Jalen Ramsey. The opening line has the hometown Rams favored by 4 which actually happens to be what our power ratings are also calling for. The better option right now appears to be the total as both offenses finished in the Top 10 in scoring with both scoring D's landing in the middle of the pack. A shootout in SoFi looks extremely possible, especially since the Rams were held to just a FG in their Super Bowl appearance of 2018!
